An ongoing collection of papers I've written exploring some of the less familiar dimensions of conversion to a wholistic and sustainable society:

TSUNAMI OF POSITIVE CHANGE, March 2019. Intro hot-linked summary of profound positive changes in process in all dimensions of our society.

LOOKING AHEAD: It's amazing, looking back, at how long ago the elements were visible for transition to a better world and life using a fraction of the resources we use. It's easy, when we're wealthy, to throw money at symptoms of problems rather than address their root issues. But how much better when we do address them!

LIVING LIGHTLY: ENERGY CONSERVATION IN HOUSING. Monograph. 1973. (Excerpts) LIVING LIGHTLY: ENERGY CONSERVATION IN HOUSING. Full monograph. 1973. This was pretty audacious. Asserting, in 1973, that we can lower our energy use by 90%. Asserting we will be happier and healthier when we do. Showing how, in our built environment. Then taking a class of prearchitecture students and *building* a demonstration house to show it works.

"AUTONOMOUS LIVING IN THE OUROBOROS HOUSE", POPULAR SCIENCE, Dec. 1975. Here's a report on that demonstration house.

THE HIDDEN COSTS OF HOUSING. Top award winning entry in the 1981 California Affordable Housing Competition. Laid out strategies to reduce housing costs by 90% through unconventional approaches to the whole spectrum of housing costs.

"FENG-SHUI: ENERGY AND PLACE", 1972. First publication in this country asserting a geophysical basis to the Chinese practice of feng-shui, and asserting the acknowledgement by other cultures of the existence of life-force energy and its central role in all aspects of a culture.

"THE END OF NUCLEAR WAR", Dec. 1986. Fifteen years before 9/11, this warned of the vulnerability of centralized high-tech societies and the importance of dealing with the real needs of everyone. Not the same scenario as 9/11, but equally scary. Rejected by *Foreign Affairs* as "too theoretical" and by *Harvard Business Review* as "not giving our CEOs 'effective policy actions'.

"VITALITY AND AFFORDABILITY OF HIGHER EDUCATION", Oct. 1993. How to reduce the cost of higher education by 90%. Nineteen years later, Stanford University professors are offering free on-line courses, with up to 160,000 students from 190 countries!

<u>RENT-ALLS</u>, 1993. Again, almost 20 years ago, showing value of CarShare/ZipCar, systems. Some of the least visible yet most important elements and concepts for creating a transportation system providing more freedom, convenience, and quality of transportation than current.

"GRANNY-FLATS AND DUPLEX-PENSIONS," RAIN, Nov. '78. Scoped out in 1978, in part implemented in several states in the late 1990s, lays out how to better use our oversized housing stock. "TILLAWATTS", 21 Jan. 2009. Lays out combining ADUs or Granny-Flats with deep energy retrofits to lessen infrastructure impacts as well as construction costs of housing. "FlexPlex" and "Two for One" lay out more physical details.

"IMPROVING THE ECONOMIC VALUE OF COASTAL PUBLIC FOREST LANDS", Dec. 1994. Updated as "FIXING FAILED FORESTS," April 2002. Only 18 years ago, examined

as example of what we "conveniently" forget to account for in conventional economics and how we achieve ten times or more effectiveness improvements using wholistic economics.

<u>"NOTES ON OUR PLASMA UNIVERSE,"</u> Oct. 2007. This one is still unfolding, but combines emerging "electric universe" information with life-force energy, as source for the plasmas that generate our material world.

SPEAKING FROM OUR SOULS:

<u>A PRAYER FOR HELP</u>, March, 1997. Leadership in transition to sustainability will come from the Third World as much as the wealthy countries. Our fears are largely what keeps us from that transition. Here is why we need each other's help.

SHOOTING PEOPLE, PDF photoessay, 5 Jan. 2007. How a digital camera can transform how we see ourselves and others.

WHAT IS TO GIVE LIGHT MUST ENDURE BURNING, 1978. Our house fire, the day we finished building. Loss and grief break us free from our rational world and plunge us deep into the interconnected consciousness from the realms of qi. The heart speaks.

"GLOBAL WARMING: TAKING REAL ACTION: 28 May 2008. Lots of real, and effective action, that can begin locally. Things that should be done with or without global warming. Sigh!

"SOME TRUTHS MAY BE TRUE" 14 Dec. 2006. North Coast Citizen. More local actions.

"BAN BILLBOARDS, BUY LESS, WORK LESS" Daily Astorian, 24 July 2008. Not promoting consumption, and consuming and working less is one real way to reduce energy use, reduce global warming, and make life better! Europeans work 25% fewer hours a year than Americans, while having greater productivity. That's the equivalent to three months more vacation every year.

"BAN INCANDESCENT LIGHTBULBS" Daily Astorian, 3 July 2008. In 2007 Australia legislated a ban on incandescent bulbs. Here was a conservative

government taking serious and forceful action on global warming. *They* cut through all those human roadblocks to change. The stuff's available now, most of the problems are resolved, and after the usual amount of grumbling, even Americans can adapt.

"BUILDING MORITORIUMS IN IMPACTED AREAS" 28 May 2008. It's amazing our government jurisdictions take no action when we discover what can be destroyed by tsunami or sea level rise. The insurance industry is pulling out from coastal areas. Why do we continue to allow construction in impact zones?

"DOUBLE VEHICLE MILEAGE NOW" 14 May 2008. Why wait? Outside the U.S., there are 38 vehicles that get 50 mpg or better. We can mandate on state levels a doubling of vehicle efficiency immediately. Here's a process.

"REQUIRE ZERO-ENERGY HOMES" Daily Astorian, 3 July 2008. Requiring zero-energy houses in our building codes can happen, and happen quickly, at local, state, or national levels. It helps homeowners. It helps the building industry, transferring investment from oil to building. It helps the future.

FUTURE WORLD OIL SUPPLIES: There IS a Finite Limit, L.F. Ivanhoe. WORLD OIL, Oct. 1995. From industry statistics - when world oil peaks, depletes; strategies for wise use, false statistics. Outstanding intro to this issue.

<u>COSMIC ECONOMICS</u>, - with Office of Energy Research & Planning, Governor's Office, State of Oregon, 1974. Growth, fueled by fossil fuels, operates on an "inversion" of values and successful practices from a sustainable society. What's now called a "Carbon Tax" originated in this article long ago, which warned of all the failure-shortcuts we're now trying, such as ethanol fuels that are not net energy producing.

"EMERGING ENERGY POLICY PRINCIPLES" - with O. E. R. P, 1974. Valuable principles for public policy to guide transitions relative to peak oil.

"INDEPENDENCE?"- with O.E.R.P, 1974. Concise summary of shift needed in energy policy.

<u>GREEN POWER OR GREED POWER</u>, NORTH COAST CITIZEN Nov. '03. When are utility-scale giant wind power plants "green", and when just more of the same old greed?

LNG IMPORTS: NEITHER SAFE NOR WISE, HIPFISH, Jan. 2005. LNG terminals are proposed around the US. They hold potential for catastrophic

accidents, can be major terrorism targets, and one of the least wise alternatives for meeting our energy needs.

"THE COST OF ENERGY SLAVES," RAIN May '76. Understanding things about energy such as energy quality, net energy, cascading use, peak oil, and how cheap oil was impossible to try to compete with can help develop wise actions as we transition beyond oil.

"FLEXPLEX ENERGY", NeahCasa, Aug. 2010. Yes, here's an innovative design for a duplex that uses 95% less energy/unit than the standard American house.

TAKING ACTION:

"FIRST THINGS FIRST: RESTORE FREE ELECTIONS," Daily Astorian, 1 June 2009. You can't have a democratic government if candidates for office have to pay today's huge fees for advertising. No civilized country permits such costs for use of public media.

"QUICK AND SIMPLE ANSWERS", 26 Oct. 2008. Here's major and simple change that we can do in our lives and in our hearts.

TEN EASY PIECES, DAILY ASTORIAN, 31 Oct. '01. Ten first steps on a path away from terrorism, greed, and violence.

<u>"GO SLOW,"</u> 18 Oct. 2007 North Coast Citizen; Global Intelligencer, Oct. 2007. Running around all the time – in our heads and in our bodies – can block out important things that bubble slowly to the surface.

"SLOW CITIES" 10 Jan. 2008 North Coast Citizen. Slow can mean time to savor!

"ACKNOWLEDGING FEARS AND HOPES," 13 July 2006. North Coast Citizen.

<u>UNEXPECTED GIFTS</u>, Solar '96 Solar Energy Association of Oregon Conference, October, 1996. A feeling for some of the non-economic benefits of a sustainable culture that are far different from those of a growth society.

<u>FINDING TIME</u>, IN CONTEXT, Spring 1994. Another brief look at the impact of a different mindset in freeing and enriching our lives when we let go of maximizing acquisition of material possessions.

"VIOLENCE/NON-VIOLENCE", MANAS, June 8, 1983. Violence has been core to our culture. A discussion here of alternatives to it.

"BEYOND AN OVERSTUFFED WORLD", 3 Nov. 2008. Images of the savings and benefits of thinking smaller in our homes.

A brief summary of the five change-of-heart principles needed for sustainability.
